Roger Pielke

Roger A. Pielke, Jr. has been on the faculty of the University of Colorado since 2001 and is a Professor in the Environmental Studies Program and a Fellow of the Cooperative Institute for Research in Environmental Sciences (CIRES). At CIRES, Roger served as the Director of the Center for Science and Technology Policy Research from 2001-2007. Roger's current areas of interest include understanding the policy and politics of science in decision making in a range of areas. In 2006 Roger received the Eduard Brückner Prize in Munich, Germany for outstanding achievement in interdisciplinary climate research. Before joining the University of Colorado, from 1993-2001 Roger was a Scientist at the National Center for Atmospheric Research. In 2007 Roger was on sabbatical at the James Martin Institute for Science and Civilization at the Said Business School, Oxford University. Roger serves on various editorial boards and advisory committees, and is the author of numerous articles and essays. He is also author, co-author or co-editor of five books. His most recent book is titled: *The Honest Broker: Making Sense of Science in Policy and Politics* published by Cambridge University Press in 2007.

Helga Nowotny is Professor em. of Social Studies of Science at ETH Zurich, Chair of the Scientific Advisory Board of the University of Vienna and member of the Governing Board of the Science Center in Berlin. Before joining ETH Zurich, she was Professor at the University of Vienna and Permanent Fellow at Collegium Budapest/Institute of Advanced Study. She has held teaching and research positions at King´s College, Cambridge, the University of Bielefeld, the Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin and at the Ecoles des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales in Paris. From 2001 – 2005 she was Chair of the European Research Advisory Board, EURAB, of the European Commission.

She has published widely in Social Studies of Science and Technology (STS) and in time studies. Her publications include *Re-Thinking Science* (with M Gibbons and P. Scott) and recently *Unersättliche Neugier: Innovation in einer ungewissen Zukunft*, 2005: *Curiosità insaziabile. L'innovazione in un futuro fragile*, 2006; *The Public Nature of Science under Assault* (coauthored), 2005; *Cultures of Technology and the Quest for Innovation*.
